Pengeluaran getah asli Malaysia meningkat 17.7 peratus pada Januari 2022

PUTRAJAYA, 15 Mac 2022 – Pada hari ini, Jabatan Perangkaan Malaysia (DOSM) menerbitkan **Perangkaan Getah Bulanan, Malaysia, Januari 2022**. Penerbitan ini memaparkan statistik pengeluaran, import, eksport, penggunaan domestik, stok, harga, bilangan pekerja, gaji & upah dan produktiviti bagi estet getah.

Memetik kepada laporan, Ketua Perangkawan Malaysia, Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin, berkata, "Pengeluaran getah asli meningkat 17.7 peratus pada bulan Januari 2022 (49,087 tan metrik) berbanding pada bulan Disember 2021 (41,690 tan metrik). Perbandingan tahunan turut menunjukkan peningkatan 7.3 peratus (Januari 2021: 45,735 tan metrik). Beliau menambah, pengeluaran getah asli Malaysia pada Januari 2022 disumbangkan terutamanya oleh sektor pekebun kecil (89.1%) berbanding sektor estet (10.9%).

Jumlah stok getah asli meningkat 8.7 peratus pada Januari 2022 kepada 310,052 tan metrik berbanding 285,245 tan metrik pada Disember 2021. Kilang pemproses getah menyumbang stok akhir sebanyak 92.3 peratus diikuti kilang pengguna getah (7.6%) dan estet getah (0.1%).

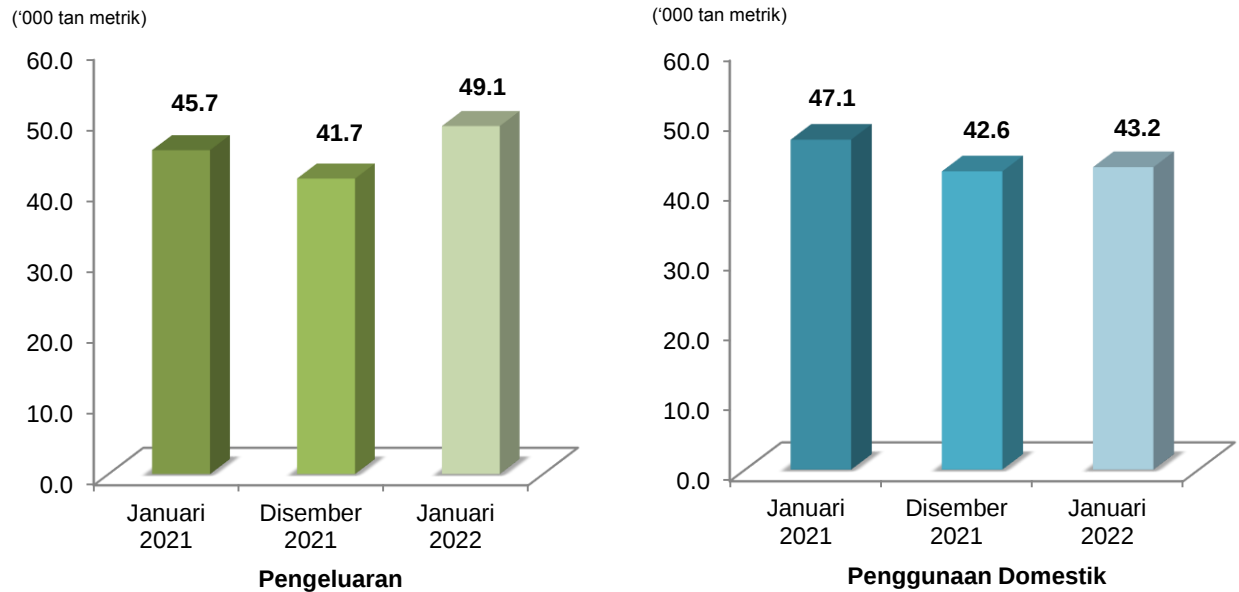
Eksport getah asli Malaysia berjumlah 51,158 tan metrik pada Januari 2022 meningkat 11.3 peratus berbanding Disember 2021 (45,982 tan metrik). China terus mendominasi sebagai pengimport tertinggi getah asli iaitu 37.7 peratus daripada jumlah keseluruhan eksport pada Januari 2022 diikuti Amerika Syarikat (7.0%), Finland (3.8%), Jerman (3.3%) dan Iran (3.2%). Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin berkata, "Prestasi eksport disumbangkan oleh produk berasaskan getah asli seperti sarung tangan getah, tayar, tiub, benang getah dan kondom. Produk sarung tangan getah merupakan eksport utama dengan nilai sebanyak RM2.2 billion pada Januari 2022, menurun 7.6 peratus berbanding Disember 2021 (RM2.3 billion)".

Analisis kepada perbandingan harga purata bulanan menunjukkan Lateks Pekat merekodkan peningkatan 6.0 peratus (Januari 2022: 572.08 sen sekilogram, Disember 2021: 539.45 sen sekilogram) dan Sekerap 3.2 peratus (Januari 2022: 603.05 sen sekilogram, Disember 2021: 548.07 sen sekilogram). Keadaan yang sama turut berlaku kepada semua jenis Getah Mutu Malaysia (G.M.M) yang meningkat antara 2.9 hingga 6.0 peratus. Perubahan harga di peringkat global seperti yang dilaporkan oleh *World Bank Commodity Price Data* turut menunjukkan harga bagi getah jenis TSR 20 (*Technically Specified Rubber*) dan SGP/MYS (Singapura/Malaysia) masing-masing meningkat 3.3 peratus (daripada USD1.72/kg kepada USD1.78/kg) dan 2.7 peratus (daripada USD1.92/kg kepada USD1.97/kg). *Malaysian Rubber Board Digest* melaporkan pemulihan dalam pasaran getah didorong oleh galakan aktiviti perkilangan global dan amaran tegas pasaran niaga hadapan getah serantau ke atas *bargain-hunting activities*. Dalam masa yang sama, kekurangan bekalan getah asli di peringkat global, lonjakan harga minyak mentah dan ringgit Malaysia kekal lemah berbanding dolar Amerika Syarikat.

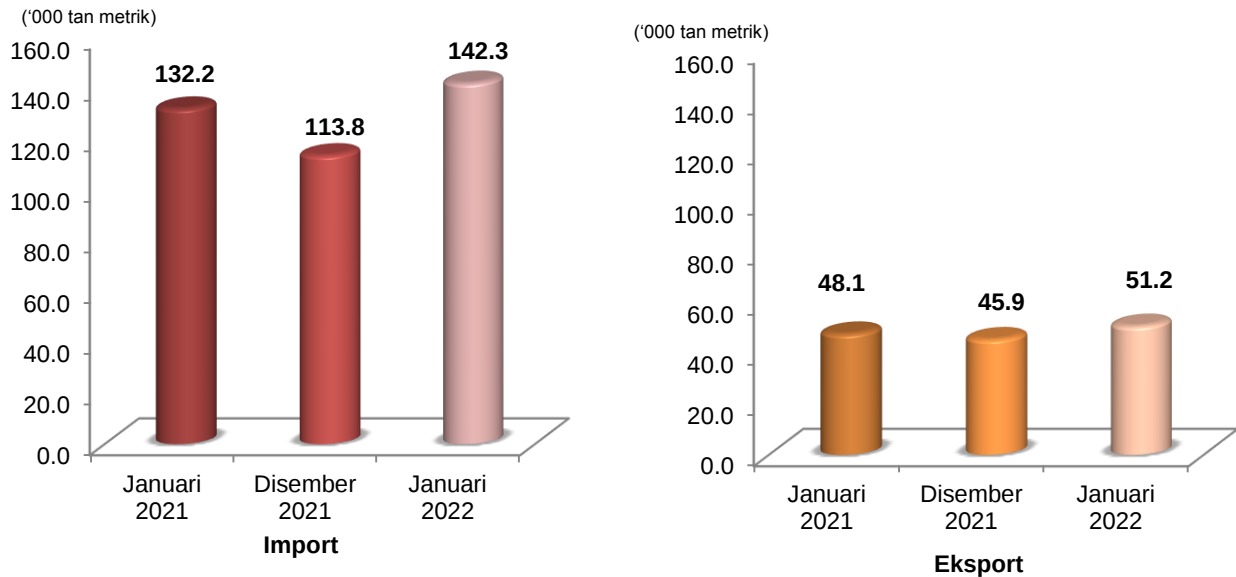

Malaysia natural rubber production
increased by 17.7 per cent in January 2022

PUTRAJAYA, March 15, 2022 – The Department of Statistics, Malaysia (DOSM) today released **Monthly Rubber Statistics, Malaysia, January 2022**. This publication consists of statistics on production, imports, exports, domestic consumption, stocks, prices, number of employees, salaries & wages and productivity of rubber estates.

Commenting on the report, Chief Statistician Malaysia, Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin, said, "Natural rubber production increased by 17.7 per cent in January 2022 (49,087 tonnes) as compared to December 2021 (41,690 tonnes). Year-on-year comparison showed that the production increased by 7.3 percent (January 2021: 45,735 tonnes). He added, production of natural rubber in January 2022 for Malaysia was mainly contributed by smallholders sector (89.1%) as compared to estates sector (10.9%).

Total stocks of natural rubber increased 8.7 per cent in January 2022 to 310,052 tonnes as compared to 285,245 tonnes in December 2021. Rubber processors factory was contributing 92.3 per cent of the stocks followed by rubber consumers factory (7.6%) and rubber estates (0.1%).

Exports of Malaysia's natural rubber amounted to 51,158 tonnes in January 2022, increased by 11.3 per cent as against December 2021 (45,982 tonnes). P.R. China continued to dominate as the highest importer of natural rubber with 37.7 per cent from total exports in January 2022 followed by United States of America (7.0%), Finland (3.8%),

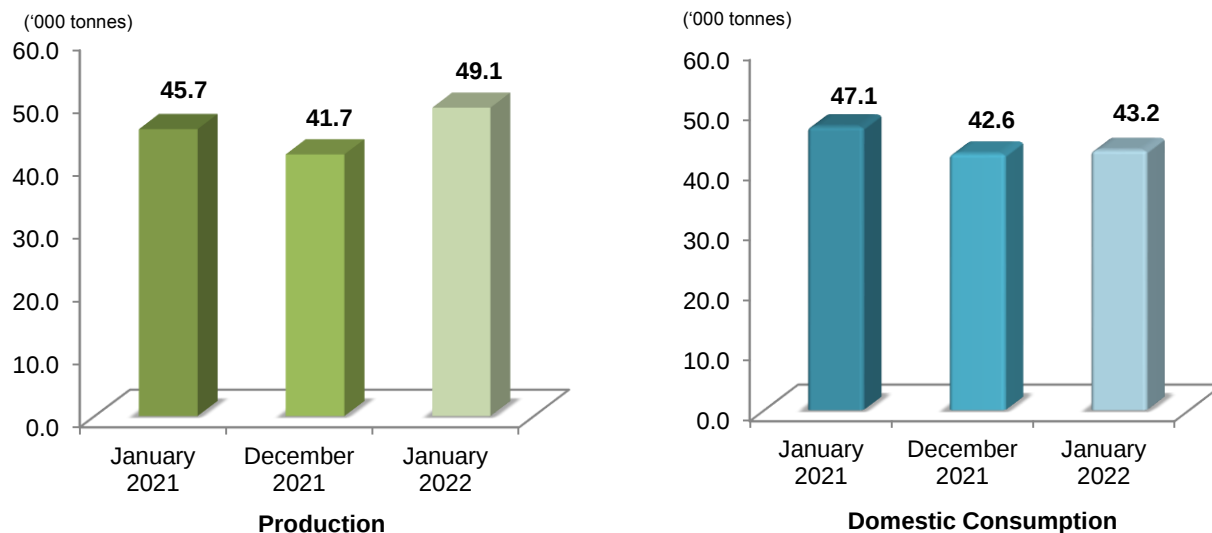
Germany (3.3%) and Iran (3.2%). Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin said, "The exports performance was contributed by natural rubber-based product such as gloves, tyre, tube, rubber thread and condom. Gloves were the main exports of rubber-based products with a value of RM2.2 billion in January 2022, a decrease of 7.6 per cent as compared to December 2021 (RM2.3 billion)".

Analysis of the average monthly price showed that Latex Concentrated recorded an increase of 6.0 per cent (January 2022: 572.08 sen per kg, December 2021: 539.45 sen per kg) and Scrap 3.2 per cent (January 2022: 603.05 sen per kg, December 2021: 584.07 sen per kg). A similar trend is also observed for all Standard Malaysian Rubber (S.M.R) which increased between 2.9 to 6.0 per cent. The movement of global prices as reported by World Bank Commodity Price Data also showed that the prices for TSR 20 (Technically Specified Rubber) and SGP/MYS (Singapore/Malaysia) type increased by 3.3 per cent (from USD1.72/kg to USD1.78/kg) and 2.7 per cent (from USD1.92/kg to USD1.97/kg) respectively. Based on Malaysian Rubber Board Digest report released in January 2022, the recovery in the market driven by encouraging global manufacturing activities and firmer advice from regional rubber futures markets from bargain-hunting activities. At the same time, tighter global natural rubber supply, surging crude oil prices and the ringgit that remained weak against the United States of America dollar.

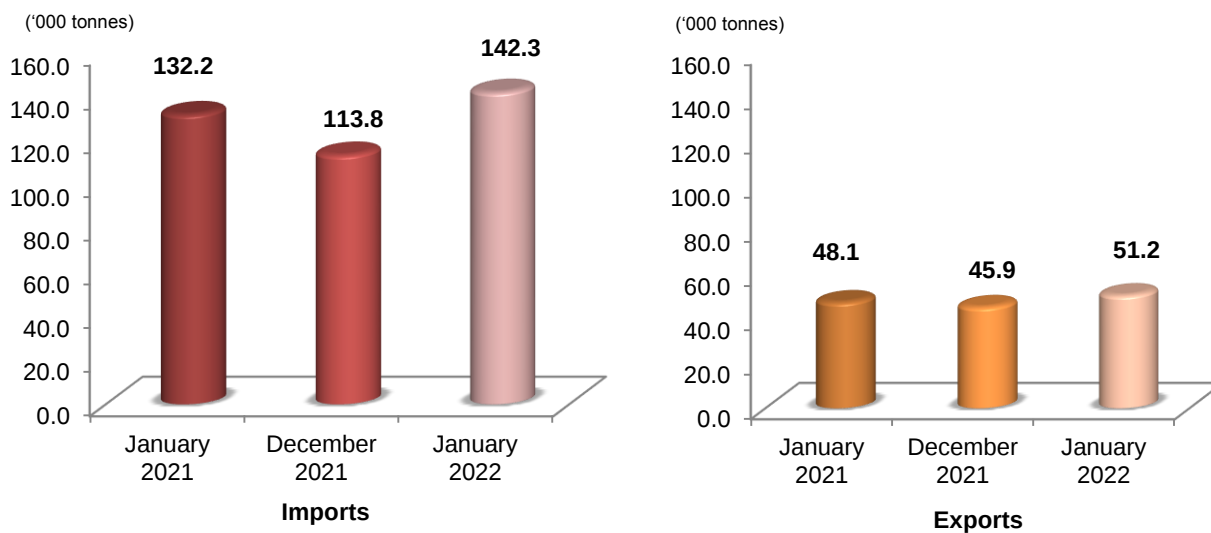
This month, DOSM will also released a newsletter on Industry of Rubber in Malaysia 2021 as an added value to the publication of rubber statistics.
