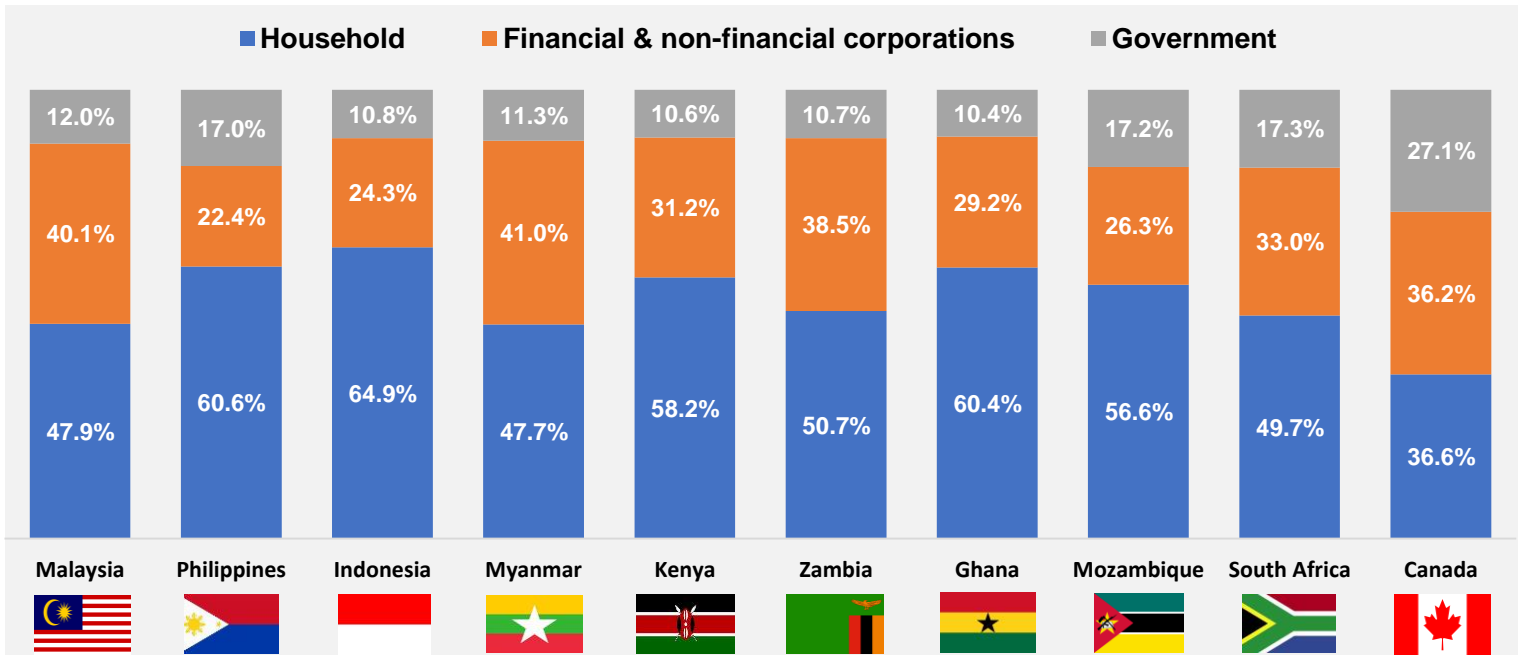

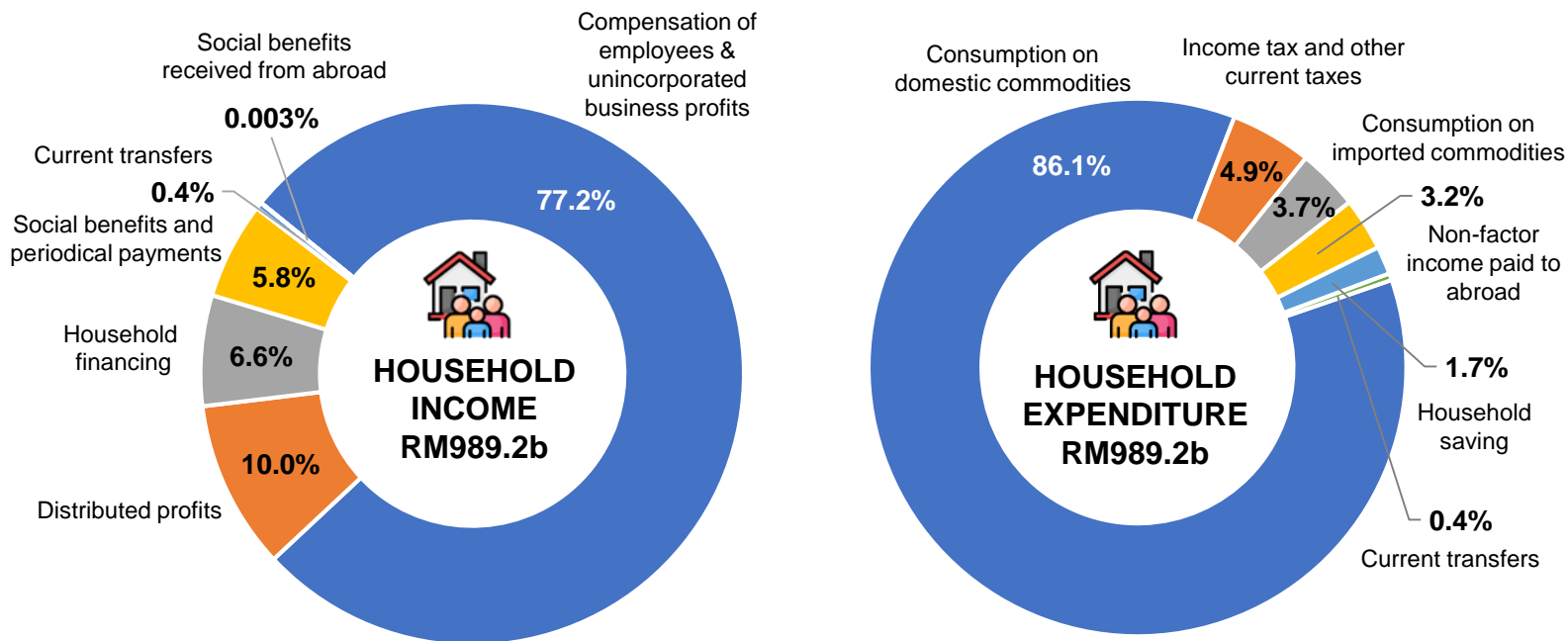
## INCOME / EXPENDITURE BY INSTITUTION FOR SELECTED COUNTRIES
