The 2024 Agriculture Census recorded 1.03 million agricultural holdings in 2023

- Agriculture Census 2024 shows a total of 1,030,020 agriculture holders, with 1,008,829 (98.0%) of them being individual agriculture holders and 21,191 (0.2%) establishments agriculture holders.
- The total number of agricultural holdings involved in the Crop sub-sector is 927,320, followed by Fisheries (48,666), Livestock (47,481), Aquaculture (10,279), and Forestry & Logging (8,464).
- By state, the top five states with the highest number of individual agricultural holdings are Sabah with 156,635, followed by Sarawak (145,378), Kedah (123,194), Perak (104,878), and Johor (102,460). Meanwhile, the top states for establishment agricultural holdings are Johor (3,578), Sabah (2,624), Perak (2,596), Pahang (2,543), and Sarawak (2,036).
- The majority of individual agriculture holder, amounted to 1,000,458 (99.1%), are owned by Malaysian citizens. By gender, there are 753,139 male holders and 255,690 female holders. In terms of age group structure, the majority of agriculture holders in Malaysia are aged 60 years and over, totaling 458,263, followed by the 46–59 age group (326,827). Bumiputera recorded the highest number of holders at 884,194, followed by the Chinese ethnic group at 97,745. The majority of individual agricultural holders are married (741,823). Meanwhile, 381,638 individual holders attained their highest education qualification at the secondary level.
- The total sales value of the Agriculture sector amounted to RM152.65 billion, with the highest contribution from organizational agricultural holdings at RM117.9 billion (72.9%) and RM43.8 billion (27.1%) from individuals. The Crop sub-sector recorded the highest sales value at RM117.88 billion, followed by Livestock (RM24.81 billion), Capture Fisheries (RM10.78 billion), Aquaculture (RM4.39 billion), and Forestry & Logging (RM3.83 billion). In terms of sales value by state, Johor recorded the highest sales value at RM27.3 billion, followed by Pahang and Sabah with RM25.1 billion, respectively.
- The workforce in the Agriculture sector recorded a total of 1,784,640 people..
