

Malaysia's Direct Investment Abroad registered a net outflow, RM33.9 billion in 2024.

- In 2024, Malaysia's Direct Investment Abroad (DIA) registered a higher net outflow amounting to RM33.9 billion as compared to RM30.1 billion in 2023.
- DIA position declined to RM622.1 billion as at the end of 2024 (2023: RM638.8 billion), while DIA income climbed to RM43.2 billion (2023: RM40.9 billion).
- The main component of DIA outflows in 2024 were Equity & investment fund shares, totalling RM26.0 billion. Meanwhile, Debt instruments shifted to a net outflow of RM7.8 billion (2023: net inflow RM12.7 billion).
- Services sector accounted for the largest outflows at RM28.7 billion with DIA income, RM31.4 billion.
- Asia was the largest contributor for DIA outflows with a value of RM26.5 billion. This was followed by the Americas at RM7.9 billion and Europe at RM3.8 billion.
- Malaysia's DIA outflows predominantly invested in Singapore (RM11.0 billion), Indonesia (RM8.6 billion) and the Cayman Islands (RM4.0 billion) in 2024.
